## PRESIDENTS REPORT

# RSA

On Armistice Day we held two services and Stiuox Rankin has written a report on both service's printed on page 12 so I will not report on Armistice Day but would sincerely like to thank all that attended the services, in particular Andy Pokaia, Chris Campbell, Ricky Nuttall, I think everyone would have to agree that the service at the Steam Scene was particularly moving.

Last month Wendy and myself, attended the 102<sup>nd</sup> RNZRSA Conference held in Wellington. The meeting resoundingly approved the adoption of the new RNZRSA Constitution. This will allow RSA's to have greater flexibility, it also allows for change to happen outside of National Council and hopefully a more effective National Council meeting's to be run. Support Services who are a very important role in RNZRSA had speakers that spoke at length on the effect of PTSD on Veterans and spoke on new methods for how to reduce the effect on Veterans and their families these included Equine Assisted therapy which helps both veterans that suffer from both mental and emotional traumatic injuries and SSAANZ and organisation that organises activities that support the social and mental health of service and ex-service people. I look forward to a really good year at the RSA but need you to support us to make it happen.



## Armistice Day 2018



### The Gallipoli Pine Dedication

The Day of 11 November has been, for 100 years, much hallowed. 2018 at the Papanui RSA was Very Special. A ceremony was held at Steam Scene on McLeans Island to commemorate the planting of a Gallipoli Pine, sauced by BJ Clark. A white fence was built around this now very young sapling and a plinth placed within

on which there rests a plaque with some very meaningful Words.

Chris Gray set the ball rolling then passed the mic to Colin Rae. Colin was all about this little tree, He planted it, organised and placed the plaque and built the picket fence. Colin said a few words which were about as self-deprpreciating as I've ever heard. He and Glenys did it all on their own bat and paid for it. Well Done You two. The Tree was Blessed in English and then in Maori.



The Last Post was played and Colin spoke the Ode  
The proceedings were held at Steam Scene where the tree now resides and will outlive us All – Highly appropriate as the Armistice was signed on a Train at Compiègne in France. Even more appropriate were the sounds of Small-arms fire from the range next-door and the piston-engine aeroplanes flying overhead.

## The Armistice Service

The Service at the War Memorial timed for 1100 got under way at the right time and was, as we expected, concise and to the point. Again, the Bugle played, and the Flag was raised. The Public turnout for this event was quite large with Servicemen and Women – Returned, Service and Current, along with the Public placed poppies. Quite a High Naval presence was observed and Sappers from 3 Field Sqn RNZE were also in attendance.

The White Crosses on the lawn were a very poignant feature ... Bringing home the reason that we Celebrate this very important date. The Guest Speaker, Andrew Pokaia, spoke of remembering All of our fallen Servicemen and Women.



When retired Fendalton wool merchant Keith Whitfield was at a rubbish burn-off in the 1940s, he saw a distinct piece of paper.

It was a billboard for *The Star*, announcing the Armistice on November 12, 1918 (NZ time), which marked the end of World War 1.

Mr Whitfield, 88, asked the owner of the billboard if he could keep it.

“He was just going to throw it into the fire and I said ‘hey, I’ll have that’,” he said.

“I thought it might be worth hanging onto, not knowing I would be here a 100 years from the date of it.”

Mr Whitfield, who lives in Fendalton, framed it and loaned it to the Papanui RSA about 20 years ago, where it is still on display.

His father Alex and his two uncles, Harold and Herb, all served in WW1.

The three Whitfield brothers all survived the war. They served in France and Egypt.

“They were very lucky. [My father] was gassed, and coughed his whole life,” he said.

Mr Whitfield never got the chance to show the poster to his father but it served as a reminder of his contribution to the country.

“Because my father fought in the war, it’s a memoir of him when I come to the RSA,” he said.

Mr Whitfield said the RSA was the best place to keep the poster and does not intend to sell it for profit. He has read *The Star* his whole life. “It’s my sole source of news, I enjoy it because everything is local.”

### **"ALEPPO PINE"**

I recently visited a small town called Rushworth in northern Victoria to visit my very sick sister who was in the "Memorial Hospital" there. This twelve bed "Memorial Hospital" was built and opened in 1948 with funds raised by the local community, the government did not have to contribute any money whatsoever.

As the name suggests the hospital was built as a memorial to the soldiers who served and who lived in the Rushworth area.

In the grounds of the hospital the "Aleppo Pine" which is a direct descendant of the Lone Pine at Gallipoli was planted by the last baby born at the hospital, a Mr. Robert Anderson. The tree was planted in 2001 and is now 15 metres in diameter and 16-18 metres high.

I counted about 12-15 seedlings growing under the tree which suggests that they grow relatively easily and are just chopped off when the lawn is mowed.

It is my hope that "Our Tree" grows with as much vigour as the one at Rushworth.

you get the cart up later."


I noticed she had a nice svelte figure, "That's mighty nice of you," I answered. "But I don't think my wife would like it." "Oh, come on now," she insisted.




